Last year 196 schools from across NSW & ACT attended with 20,513 students. In addition, over 100 schools watched lived or downloaded the event.

The program consists of a dramatic live crash reenactment that includes Police, Ambulance Service of NSW and Fire & Rescue. Interactive displays and crash survivor speakers bring home the road safety message with passion and clarity. The forum is run by the Westmead Hospital Trauma Service for school years 10 - 12with the specific purpose of educating our youth and reducing road fatalities and injuries in this high risk group.
