The program consists of a dramatic live crash re-enactment that includes Police, Ambulance Service of NSW and Fire & Rescue. Interactive displays and crash survivor speakers bring home the road safety message with passion and clarity. The forum is run by the Westmead Hospital Trauma Service for school years 10 – 12 with the specific purpose of educating our youth and reducing road fatalities and injuries in this high risk group.

Covid Changes for 2021

- 1. Starting later at 10.30am (end 12.30pm)**
To ensure Covid safe seating, we are starting later to ensure all schools have enough time to arrive and be seated.
- 2. No Interactive Displays**
Qudos Bank Arena's Covid policy prevents us from having any lunch time displays for 2021.
- 3. No Lunch Break**
As we are not permitted to have interactive displays, there will be no lunch break. However, students will be permitted to eat in their seats at a designated time during the program.
- 4. No student bags**
As in previous years, no students are permitted to bring in any form of school bag – only their lunch in a see-through plastic bag and no cans or drinks or food (e.g. tins of tuna). Teachers are able to bring one bag no larger than 30cm x 30cm for student medications.

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
