One day in 2009 Heidi and her mother Jenni had been out riding their motorbikes, their favourite thing to do together. Then as Heidi neared home in Wollongong she was t-boned by a ute and bulldozed into the guard rail. She survived but sustained a spinal cord injury, injuries to her left foot, a fractured ankle, lung contusions, a fractured neck and a fractured left scapula in her shoulder. Heidi spent seven months in rehabilitation learning basic living skills again.

"I tell students, don't succumb to peer pressure – it's just not worth it. Use your head and do what you know is right"- Heidi.
